The season continues in full swing and we appreciate all of you who come to the Club and enjoy Jam Sessions, Karaoke nights and the daily specials offered in the Restaurant.

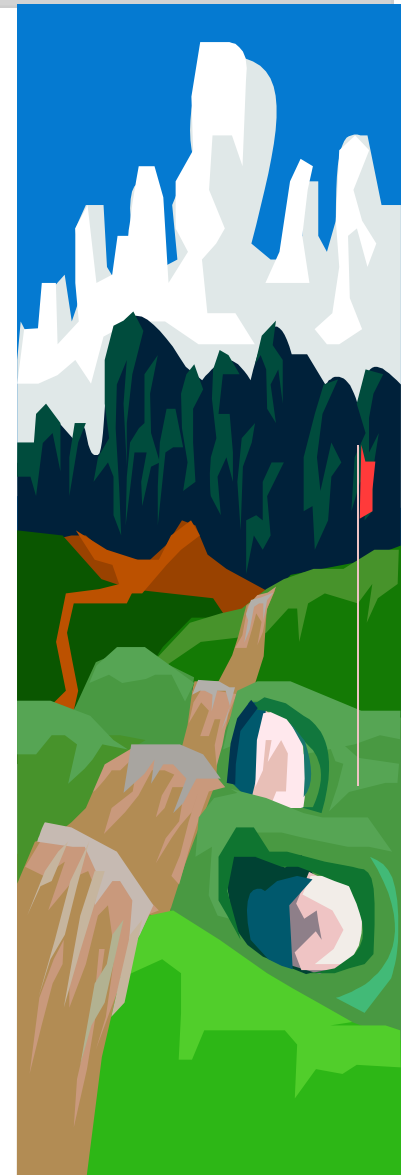
New Restaurant Menu

Golf Course Issues:

There is a re-occurring problem that needs to be rectified during each month of the year. This problem is magnified during January, February and March. It is persons and groups making tee times: If you have a change of plans you must notify the Golf Staff of your cancellation. When the Golf Staff receives notification of a reservation change it will alert other residents of the opening which allows as many of you to play golf as possible.

The Golf Staff will begin April 1, 2011 to implement the following policy: If a reserved tee time is not cancelled you will receive a warning. If this happens a second time you will lose privileges to book a tee time for two (2) weeks. Any subsequent infractions within the calendar year will result in additional lose of two (2) weeks golf tee time booking privileges. The Club does not like to make this type of rule but it is required that everyone respect the tee time policy. If a tee time is not going to be used it is to be made available to other Residents. THOUGHTS OF THE DAY

The bottom line is that reality is not happening out there. It is happening in here (inside of us) first, and then what we observe and see is just a projection of the internal stories we have told ourselves over and over again. That is why there can never be a happy ending to an unhappy story, nor can there be an unhappy ending to a happy journey. External reality is only a mirror to our internal perception, and it can only play itself out because of what we believe to be real inside of us first.

The content of every story we tell ourselves is always set against a backdrop of past or future. Because of this, our stories are never happening in real time—the here and NOW—and therefore are only as true as we make them out to be. Every ounce of resistance in our bodies, every time there is tension in our swings, every unhappy story we energize and tell ourselves; each of these scenarios can come about only because we have distanced ourselves from the cool, calm, anticipatory perfection of the here and NOW. In order to get back into the “game” we only have to do one thing; come back to right NOW. Keep coming back to this shot, keep coming back to this breath, keep coming back to a thought that feels good; but whatever we do, keep coming back again and again to the stillness and joy and unimaginable power that can only be accessed in this only moment in time.

Q. So how do expectation and desire fit in (if we are to play our best golf)?

A. I believe there has to be a strong, positive desire within us every time we hit a golf shot to connect the ball with the target or the hole. This positive emotional connection is something we want before every shot; something we want to consciously and deliberately plug into the equation in every pre-shot routine. We have to train ourselves to expect the best, desire the best, believe in the best, and be the best. And then, and here is where most of this manifestation stuff gets really screwy, we have to be OK with whatever unfolds before our eyes. Because whenever we have high expectations and then throw in an immediate hissy fit over a shot we don't like, we sabotage our energy moving forward. We anchor into the cells of the body and send a signal to the Universe that invites more of the shots we are trying to avoid, simply because we didn't stay in the flow of the positive expectation and desire which we briefly had. No, we really want to keep expecting that great things will automatically unfold from a happy, positive, eager, anticipatory state of mind. And then we learn to be OK with whatever is, simply because it is and could be no other way than what it is right here and Now.

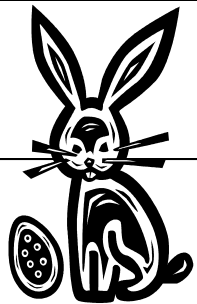

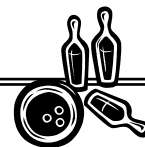


TRI PALMS WINTER LEAGUE BOWLING
